Key Responsibilities

- Complete site visits with potential "Make it Home" Program clients
- Perform home inspections to assess home for minimum Make it Home Program livability requirements.
- Assess safety issues at the home and document needed repairs
- Convey to client any actions they may need to take to get home into Make it Home program
- Upload completed survey and pictures to Loveland app with smartphone or tablet.

Qualifications and Requirements

- Basic computer skills Microsoft Office (Word, Excel), Google Calendar, Loveland Survey App
- Ability to perform home inspection solo and interact with clients
- Time management skills
